WHEN.

Friday 9th – Sunday 18th September 2011

WHERE.

Currumbin Beach, Pacific Parade, Currumbin

HOW TO GET THERE.

Bus.

Translink bus stops are located:

- At the northern end of Currumbin Beach opposite The Rocks Resort.
- Centrally located on Pacific Parade opposite the Elephant Rock Cafe. *This location is closest to the information tent and workshop site.*
- Buses do stop at the Alley car park - *northern end which is where Sculpture 1 is located.*

Hired Bus.

The Alley car park can be used as a student drop off and pick up zone. Buses are required to park off site for the duration of the student's walk. Medium term parking is available along Durringan Street.

Walking.

Classes travelling on foot from nearby schools are best to arrive at the northern end to start at Sculpture 1 - also known as Currumbin Alley end.

Car.

Students arriving in different cars should plan to meet at the Alley carpark, this is the start of the exhibition. Disabled parking is available at the Alley car park and near the Information Hub.

ARRIVAL.

When we arrive, what happens?

If your sculpture walk includes a workshop, 15 minutes prior, assemble outside the Nippers Club. You will be met by a Swell Team member who will give the students a safety talk and direct you to the artist conducting the workshop. After the workshop, you are free to do the sculpture walk.

If you are doing the sculpture walk only, please wander the exhibition at your leisure. Teachers are able to purchase the official program at three locations along the walk. Information Tents at either end and the Information Hub located centrally along Pacific Parade. Enquires can be made here and further information obtained too.

WORKSHOPS.

Workshops are conducted at:

The Junior Surf Lifesaving – Nippers Club
Pacific Parade, Currumbin.

Next to Elephant Rock Cafe

The artist will provide information about the workshop.

SAFETY.

Teachers and group supervisors are responsible for the supervision and behaviour of students. Please follow individual school procedures for safety and risk management.

Students need to wear enclosed shoes, are to respect the dunal areas and are to keep to designated pathways. Pedestrian crossings are to be used at all times.

We ask for your cooperation in protecting the works of art by not allowing children to climb on any sculptures. Please supervise children at all times when they are exploring the artworks. Children must not touch any lighting components on the sculptures.

The beach is a public venue and children should be advised by their teachers to behave accordingly.

A first aid kit is available at the Information Hub.

Advise students that if they become lost to go to the nearest Information Hub or Tent. We will be able to help you regroup.

BREAK TIMES.

Schools bringing morning tea or lunch can make use of the shaded areas along the beach front. Water is available for purchase at the Information Hub and Tents. Please dispose of rubbish thoughtfully.

TOILETS.

Toilets are available at the Junior Surf Lifesavers Nippers Club during the workshops, amenities are available for use adjacent to the Information Hub in Murraba Street or in the park opposite the Alley car park.
